

## 05 Incheon Port Floodgate (Information Center)



The floodgate at the Incheon Port is the first architectural structure of its kind. It was built to enable ships to enter and exit the port freely, and is designed to function with tidal differences of up to 10 meters.

**Tip** The Floodgate Information Center provides information on the Incheon Port and its floodgate and offers various interactive programs, including virtual ship navigation. **Opening Hours** 09:00 to 18:00 (last admission at 17:30; closed on weekends.) **Contact** Tel. 032) 770-4519

## 06 Korea Traditional Park



Founded on the site of Wolmi Park, Korea Traditional Park features landscaping works that reenact the palatial, cottage, and residential gardens of the Joseon Dynasty. The palatial gardens include flower systems, Buyongji and Aeryeonji Ponds, and the Amisan Chimney. The cottage garden features Sosaewon, Gukdamwon, and vegetation habitats. The residential garden features Yangjindang and a traditional Korean-style house that was popular among commoners in the Joseon Dynasty. **Opening Hours** 09:00 to 20:00 in summer; 09:00 to 19:00 in winter (Inside Yangjindang: 09:00 to 18:00 in summer; 09:00 to 17:00 in winter) **Contact** Tel. 032) 765-4133

## 07 Wolmi Park Observatory



Rising 23 meters above the summit of Wolmi Park, this observatory provides panoramic views of downtown Incheon, the West Sea, Incheon Port, Incheon International Airport, Incheondaeyo Bridge, and the sunset on the horizon. Amenities on site include a cafeteria, a reading café, and an interactive art space consisting of message blocks. **Opening Hours** Observatory - 07:00 to 22:00 / Wolmi Dalbitmaru (café) - 11:00 to 19:00 (may close earlier in winter) **Contact** Tel. 032) 765-4133 (observatory); 032) 765-0727 (café)

## 08 Incheon Landing Operation Sign Stone



On September 15, 1950, the South Korean Army and the UN Troops together launched the historic Incheon Landing Operation, which reversed the course of the Korean War. Troops began landing on the green-colored beach (on the left) of Wolmido Island at 06:33, with reinforcements arriving on the red-colored beach (on the right) at Bukseong Port at 17:33 the same day. **Contact** Tel. 032) 832-9411, 032) 760-6473

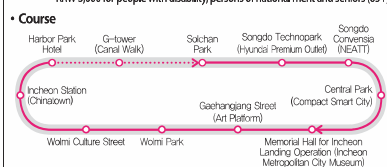

## 01 Wolmi Amusement Park



Boasting a scenic surrounding landscape, the Wolmi Amusement Park draws visitors throughout the year with its exciting music and thrilling rides. **Opening Hours** 10:00 to 22:00 on weekdays / 10:00 to 23:00 on the weekends (depending on the rides/stores). **Admission Charges** Starting from KRW 4,500 for adults and KRW 3,500 for children (All-Rides Pass available).

## 02 Wolmi Culture Street (Cafes, Music Fountain, and Seawater Footbath)



Extending for some 600 meters from end to end, this seaside-street-on-the-beach features dozens of seafood restaurants and cafes and provides a perfect venue for a wide range of sea- and culture-themed events. **Opening Hours** Seawater Foot Bath: 10:00 to 20:00 (closed on Mondays) / Music Fountain: 13:00 to 22:00 (from April to October only; closed on Mondays). **Contact** Tel. 032) 765-4169

## 03 Wolmi Ferry



The ferry departs from Wolmido Island and tours along a route that extends via Jagyokdo Island, Yeongjongdaeyo Bridge, Arabaetgil Floodgate, and Cheongna International City. The beautiful nightscape seen on the ferry provides a great backdrop for romantic dates, family gatherings, and corporate events. **Operating Hours** First ferry of the day at 11:00 (Duration: 1 hour and 20 minutes) **Fares** KRW 16,000 for adults, KRW 10,000 for children **Contact** Tel. 032) 765-1171 (\* All passengers must present their IDs when requested.)

## 04 Museum of Korea Emigration History



This first emigration-themed museum in Korea came into being in 2003 with donations and support from the citizens of Incheon and Korean emigrants abroad in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the first Korean migration to the United States. # Wolmido

The name of the island literally means "the tail of the moon," and was given to the island because of its shape. Wolmido Island was at the center of the numerous tumultuous events in modern Korean history, including the Russo-Japanese War, the French invasion of Korea in 1866, and the Incheon Landing Operation during the Korean War. After the creation of levees extending for one kilometer to the mainland in 1923, the island began to develop into a major destination for tourism and relaxation, with seawater baths, cottages, fine-dining restaurants, and outdoor pools that were developed for Japanese tourists. The distance between the island and mainland has been completely reclaimed. Wolmi Park, the Culture Street, Wolmi Amusement Park, and various other features continue to make the island the most popular destination in Incheon for visitors from both Korea and abroad.
